Thankyou to our Mayor Cr Hadi Saab for visiting us last week!



We were very pleased to welcome the very affable and switched-on City of Kingston Mayor, Cr Hadi Saab who visited us this week and discussed the plans and progress of the City of Kingston and its many projects. It's a credit to him that he gave up his full-time work to fully commit himself so he could serve as Mayor to the best of his capabilities. When asked about the future of the strip shopping centres such as Chelsea, he indicated that there needed to be a lot more resources directed towards the areas between Mordialloc and Carrum to help them to achieve their potential. Council had been given only \$2.4M from the LXRP program to implement very limited modifications for Edithvale, but he said it could take years, maybe a decade to make substantial improvements. He said Chelsea and surrounding areas have been extremely under-developed and under-invested in over the past decades and needs large scale restructure (eg. Drainage works) before beautification works can proceed. He wants to foster a sense of civic pride in our city.

Cr Saab said Kingston is a very young, energetic council. They claim to be the youngest council in Australia! He is the third youngest Mayor in Victoria, and says having a young council is important for future-proofing Kingston. Council invited residents to be a part of a 220 person community reference panel, which will help guide council decisions. 617 people of varying ages, backgrounds and expertise applied for the panel. He said community should be at the centre of everything they do. He encourages us to nominate people for Kingston Citizen of the Year, and said we can also nominate Community Group of the Year.

One of the aims in the past few years of Kingston council is to make sport facilities available to everyone in the community. A playground strategy is underway to rationalise playground distribution and design, and a new Youth strategy (young people make up 15% of Kingston) is also in progress.

Diversity and inclusion is very important – residents come from 150 different countries speaking 120 different languages. We need to create a place where everyone is safe and different ways of life can co-exist. Kingston Council was one of the first councils to endorse the <u>Uluru Statement from the Heart</u>.

Kingston Council is part of the <u>South East Councils Climate Change Alliance</u>, and has started a partnership with APR Plastics to <u>recycle soft plastic</u> by turning it into types of oil to use in making more plastic and bitumen. There are five recycling centres for soft plastic. Eight skip bins of soft plastic have been collected in a week and a half!

Cr Saab is very impressive and clearly is very committed to his role as Mayor. He certainly has lots of energy, and we thank him for coming to update us and speak with us, answering quite a few of our curly questions as well.

We were delighted to award **Zorica Djuric** a certificate of appreciation for her never-ending support and help in assisting with the Junior Mayor and Junior Council Programme \rightarrow

Winter Warmers are a fantastic group of volunteers who help many families in need. They are looking for volunteers from Rotary to help pack boxes of goods for families who are doing it tough.

Date: Sunday 21st May Place: St Aidens Carrum Time: 9-2 (more hands will take less time) Tea and coffee provided, bring your own lunch.

Please let Maree know if you can help, even for some of the time, using the email link at the top of this **newsletter**.

Winter Warmer Hampers are provided to vulnerable families in the Carrum/Seaford area through schools and kindergartens – this may expand as funds permit.

Families identified by each participating school receive a hamper of new winter goods at the start of June in time for the colder weather. In the pilot year, 2011, hampers were delivered to 29 families and in 2012, 27 families (111 people) were supported.

The aim of the program is to provide some physical and emotional support by demonstrating that the local community cares. All goods are new and include items such as blankets, gloves, socks, beanies, baby clothes, food and grocery vouchers. The content of the packs is adjusted to suit the specific family members.

Hampers are distributed to the families through school and kindergarten staff. Families are not identified & their privacy is maintained. Schools that have participated previously include: Carrum Primary, Seaford Primary, Seaford North Primary, and the Rene Anderson Kindergarten.

If you would like to help: Thank-you! Help is most needed as follows:

Donating Time: Making Children's Scarves, Hats, Baby Wear, and making Baby Blankets.

(Donated wool is available for this.)

Donating New Goods: Wool, Adult or Children's sized socks, Gloves, Beanies, and New Blankets.

Donating Money: For purchase of Special grocery vouchers (no alcohol or cigarettes) as well as any missing hampers items.

Please speak to the Principal of your school about participating in the program.

Hamper requests are due from schools in May.

To maintain privacy, we do not have direct contact with hamper recipients.


