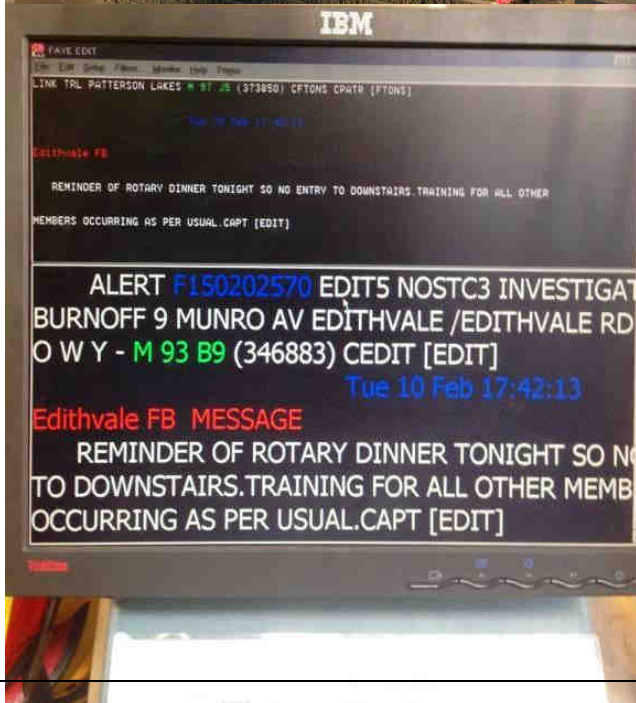

"The Edithvale Fire Brigade is an active fully volunteer fire brigade that supports the local community with a broad range of fire and rescue services, including emergency medical response in support of Ambulance to critically ill patients, and a range other emergency management support, advice and community education. Our close to 100 volunteer members comprise residents of our local community and are trained to professional standards. Each year our volunteers attend well in excess of 300 emergency calls and provide state-wide support to major emergencies.

The Edithvale Fire Brigade was formed in 1925. Over the last 90 years, the volunteers have served its community with a high level of diligence and commitment. The Brigade moved to its current station in 1969 from a location on the Nepean Highway in the Edithvale Railway reserve."

Items from the last Board Meeting:

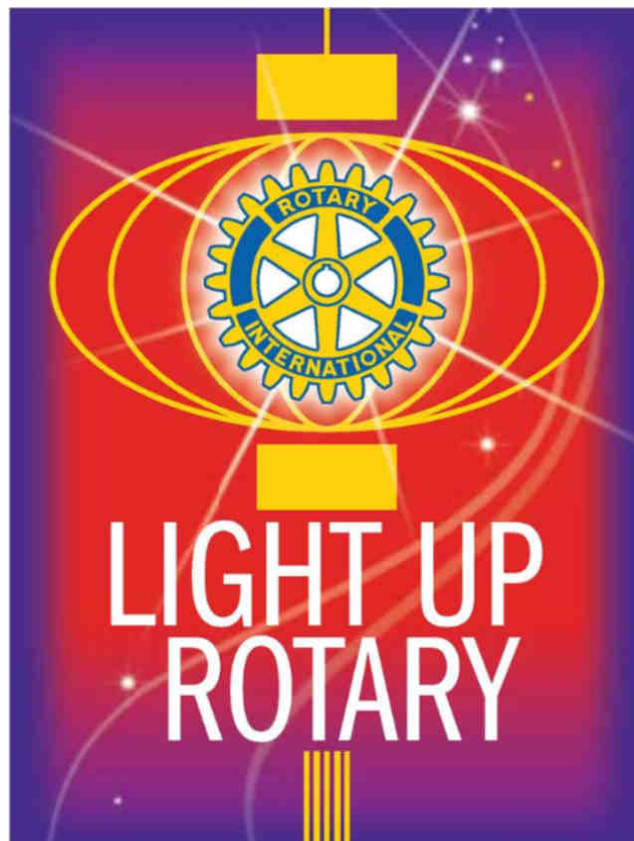
- A District grant is well under way for the Soap Aid Project.

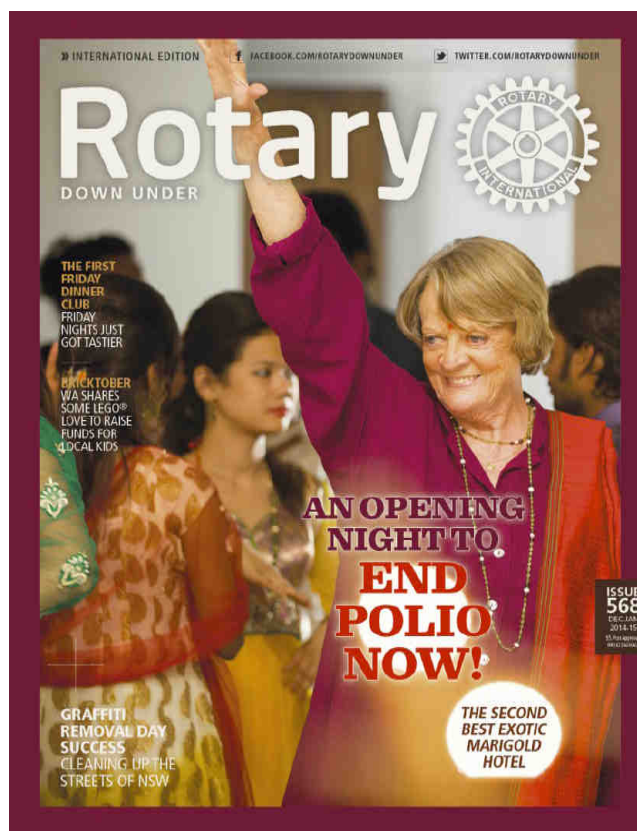
