Dear Simon,

During 2014 the Chelsea Rotary had donated a total of \$7,250 resulting from:

- Shed Mates assistance at the \$1,000 Chelsea Art Show
- Shed Mates assistance \$3,750 at the Farmers Market
- Donation to both the Men's Shed \$2,500 and the Community Breakfast

We at the Chelsea Men's are extremely appreciative and grateful for Chelsea Rotary's on going support.



The funds have been well spent as follows:

1. Art show \$1,000. We purchased a wood lathe and replaced our BBQ with a new one.
2. Farmers Market \$3,750. These funds have been utilised in our new shed project for tools and equipment and contribution towards the electrical works.
3. Donation of \$2,500. Half (1,250) went to support the Wednesday Community Breakfast, with the balance (\$1,250) used to replace worn out tools and equipment in the existing shed.

We understand that one of Chelsea Rotary are planning to hold their April meeting here at Blantyre Avenue, which we welcome as it will give you and your members an opportunity to see the new shed project completed.

Thank you again for your support during 2014 and we look forward to an on going partnership with you.
