Hi guys (hello ladies),

The "Shed" holds an important place in the Australian culture. It can be a reservoir of memories, experiences, a place to share skills and to socialise.

However, many retired people have had to downsize their living arrangements, often resulting in the man's personal space, usually the garden shed or workshop, being lost. Men's Sheds started in Australia in Lane Cove in 1997 (their shed was built for "Shedless men") but they can also be found in Scotland, England, Wales, Ireland, Finland and Greece. There are over 2000 Mens Sheds around Australia.

Over the past five years the Rotary Club of Chelsea has donated over \$5000 to the Chelsea Mens Shed, enabling them to build a new metalworking shed. President Gary Rogers gave us a guided tour and told us what they do. They are open five days a week and have women joining them on Monday and Tuesday. We had a great meal whilst Andrea Pitt, facilitator for the womens group, told us about some of the things that the women had made. They also host a big community breakfast on Wednesdays. They provide a workshop for Connecting Skills, a Mornington based group for people with disabilities, and also undertake projects for local schools (eg. Bonbeach Primary, Chelsea Primary and Chelsea Kindergarten picnic tables and seats) and other groups (eg gift hampers from recycled fence palings).

This week Mark Balla will speak to us about his passion to provide toilets for school students in India.

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

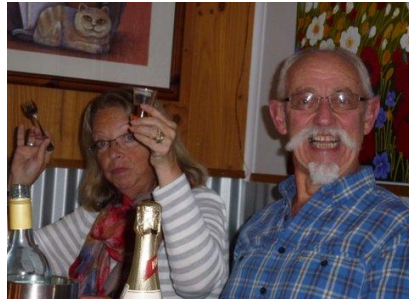
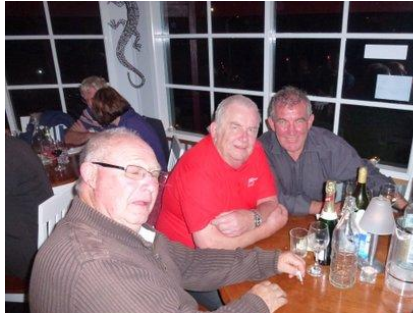
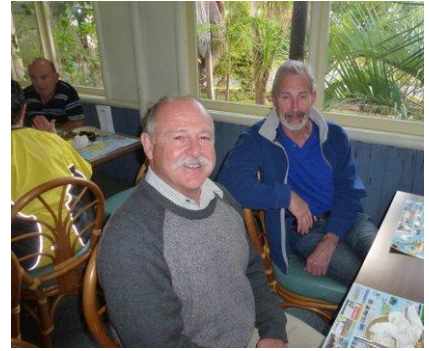
