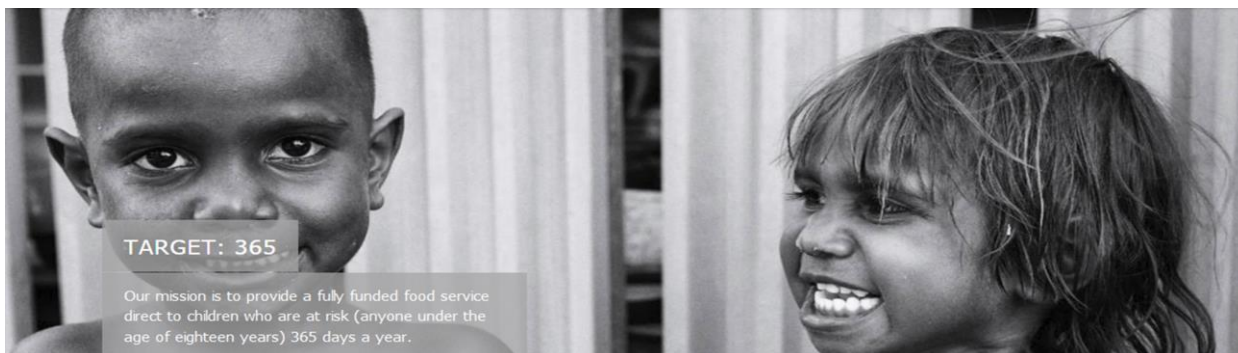

Thank you to Kevin for allowing us to meet there after the RSL (and 10,000 homes) lost all power due to a car accident. It just goes to show that you can never have TOO large an office. You never know when the local Rotary Club will need to meet there. I wonder if Paul Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, Hiram Shorey and Harry Ruggles ever thought of that? After visiting the [SoapAid](#) project earlier on Tuesday afternoon with myself, Claire and Kevin, and speaking with SoapAid CEO Mike Matulick, our District Governor David Tolstrup and his wife Allison came and spoke to our club about their vision for the coming year, and Allison spoke about her project. Allison chose a project headed by Liz Guiver, District Indigenous Support chair of the [Feed The Little Children \(FTLC\) project](#) which aims to provide skills to parents to cook for their own families. The funds raised will probably be around \$20,000 which will help feed a lot of young indigenous children, the benefits of which will last long into the future. Up to 89% of Indigenous Australian families live below the [Henderson Poverty Line](#). Household food insecurity is directly linked through research to a range of serious issues including but not limited to health/wellbeing/mental health and crime for example, mental health problems in mothers and children are doubled when mothers are food insecure.



This week we are delighted to be back at the Chelsea RSL presenting donations to the beneficiaries of our recent Art Show. This is always a great night when we help some of the organisations in our local Chelsea area. I hope you can all be there.

Melbourne's Best Farmers Markets

Food cannot get any fresher than at a local Farmers Market

The messaging of buying local rather than imported for better health as well as supporting local businesses has seen an increase in Farmers Markets forming all across Melbourne. Whether it has been picked, plucked, brewed or stewed you simply cannot get it fresher than at a local Farmers Market. Farmers markets allows the shoppers to meet the farmer/grower/producer face to face whilst discovering where your food comes from and how it is grown.

The Kingston Farmers Market began in 2004, and today boasts between 50 and 60 stallholders. Occupying a large space on Nepean Highway, right near the Southland flyover, you'll find a little bit of everything here, from dried fruit and nuts, to fresh herbs, olive oil and olives, fresh produce, tea, wine and homemade biscuits. Be sure to forgo breakfast that morning though, as there are so many stalls serving up hot pies, French crepes, bacon and eggs, and hot and hearty soup.
