## Student interviews at Parkdale Secondary College

Every year the Rotary Club of Mordialloc holds interviews for students at Parkdale Secondary College, aimed at assessing how well the students have planned their studies and careers, and how they are realistically progressing. This year they will be interviewing 230 students between 9am and noon on Wednesday the 18th of November, and Bob Travers, their Youth Director, has asked our club if we would like to help. Bob says they need 40 interviewers altogether, but he doesn't expect to fill this requirement purely with Rotarians. He says a list of suggested questions will be provided which will give interviewers a guide to asking questions which will help the students assess their preparations for their career, be it professional or trade or whatever (some kids just want to be professional surfers or PE teachers, which is fine, but they still need a PLAN).

This is a wonderful experience for RYLA graduates, or even colleagues with whom you work (it can often introduce them to Rotary). A certain level of maturity is required, but please feel free to ask your friends and neighbours, work associates and relatives if they would like to spend a few hours to help secondary students to assess and reflect on how they have planned (or should be planning) for the rest of their lives. It is very rewarding and you will meet some really switched on students whose maturity and confidence will amaze you, whilst others will need a bit more prompting and convincing to believe how a few well thought out career moves, and some timely, focussed effort can make all the difference to their life.

The students are usually well prepared (some are OVER prepared) and almost without exception present themselves very well for these interviews.

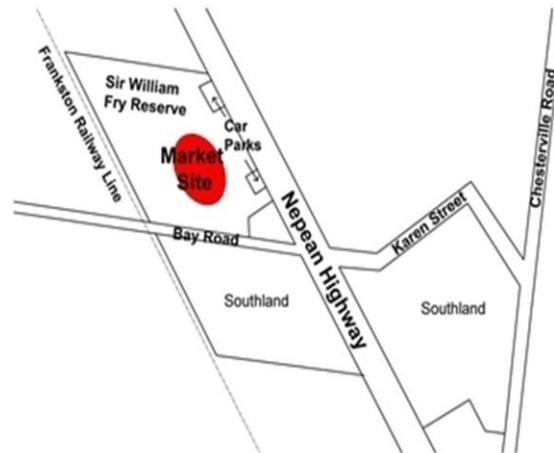
