

We are pleased to share that the Chelsea Men's Shed will soon have a permanent home at 71 Catherine Avenue, Chelsea. Council has appointed builder Simbuilt to refurbish the former Chelsea Kindergarten building to create the new home for the Men's Shed.

Kingston Council is investing \$1.3 million in the project and welcomes the partnership with the Victorian Government (\$80,000) and the Men's Shed (\$40,000) to complete the works.



It has taken nearly 6 years to arrange the new site at Catherine Avenue. Kingston Council gave approval in 2019 and work commenced in 2023. Excellent sponsors, including the Commonwealth Bank, Bendigo Bank Aspendale Gardens, Lowe Foundation and the Victorian Government all assisted.

Sandy gave us an update on the progress of the new Mens Shed facility which has been renovated on the old Kindergarten site in Chelsea. Alot of work has gone into the renovation, but the building now looks incredible. Asbestos had to be removed, sound proofing installed, flooring redone, windows replaced, new roof, toilets upgraded, with a disability toilet and shower installed and a workshop area 8 x 20 metres created. March is the estimated completion date and no doubt all are eagerly awaiting the move to the new premises.

A Women's Programme will be offered on a Tuesday. A three-week course providing basic use of power tools etc.

To date – the current members have been making possum boxes and have also rebuilt a rocking horse for one very thrilled lady.

Well done Sandy and all the others who have managed and assisted with this huge Community project.

EQUIPMENT FOR NEW SCHOOL -DREKETI VILLAGE, QAMEA ISLAND, FIJI - PETER BATTEN


