GUEST SPEAKER – CHERYL WEBSTER PHF – KNITTED KNOCKERS AUSTRALIA

Cheryl is the Founder and President of this organisation, which is a non-profit company engaging women and groups all over Australia, to knit prostheses for breast cancer survivors who have had a mastectomy. The prosthesis is very soft and light to wear, made from 100% cotton and stuffed with hobby filler from Spotlight. The prostheses are free and only postage is requested to help with costs.

Cheryl was awarded Senior Victorian of the Year in 2018, a very worthy recipient of the award.

Knitted Knockers was first started 13 years ago by the CWA as a knitting project. There are now 20 branches in Australia, with the head office in Burwood, Victoria. The organisation has 16,000 registered knitters and many thousands of prostheses have been handed out.

President Peter had much pleasure in presenting Cheryl with a cheque for \$500 to assist with materials and costs. He thanked Cheryl for her interesting insight into the organisation which was very enlightening for our Members.
