GUEST SPEAKER – KEN MIRAMS – 9815 YOUTH DIRECTOR

Ken gave us an informative presentation of District 9815 YOUTH PROTECTION POLICY, designed for the protection of children (under 18 years of age), involved in "**ROTARY YOUTH PROGRAMS**".

District 9815 encourages Rotarians to have a **WORKING WITH CHILDREN CARD** and a completed **VOLUNTEER DECLARATION FORM.** If a Rotarian decides not to have one or both of these, there are restrictions with **ROTARY YOUTH PROGRAMS**, they can participate in.

If there is a report that a child has been molested at a Rotary event, the Club should -

- 1. PROTECT THE CHILD
- 2. REPORT THE INCIDENT TO POLICE
- 3. ENSURE ACCUSED HAS NO CONTACT WITH YOUTH
- 4. NOTIFY ROTARY INTERNATIONAL OF INCIDENT VIA KEN MIRAMS
- 5. PROTECT THE PRIVACY OF ALL CONCERNED.

Ken also advised that if Members have any doubts on this or other Youth related issues, they can discuss with him.


It was also suggested our Club consider the appointment of a Club Protection Officer and the need to manage who is qualified to work on **ROTARY YOUTH PROGRAMS.**
