Screen teams sound out Parkdale pupils

PUPILS at Parkdale Primary School had their hearing tested free of charge last month thanks to a Rotary Club of Chelsea and Kingston Council backed program.

Eight second-year audiology students from University of Melbourne's Melbourne School of Health Sciences worked in teams of two to test the hearing of 66 children.

Screenings take about 30 minutes each.

Rotary helpers kept waiting children entertained with paper, crayons and pencils to draw.

At the end of the day, 43 children were found to have no hearing issues, 13 had a slight hearing loss measured on the day and were referred for further testing and 10 needed to be retested to ensure there was no permanent loss of hearing.

Newborns are screened for hearing difficulties in maternity hospitals and audiologists out in the field focus on middle ear health and any associated hearing complaints.

All ears: Audiology university students tested the hearing of more than 60 pupils at Parkdale Primary School.

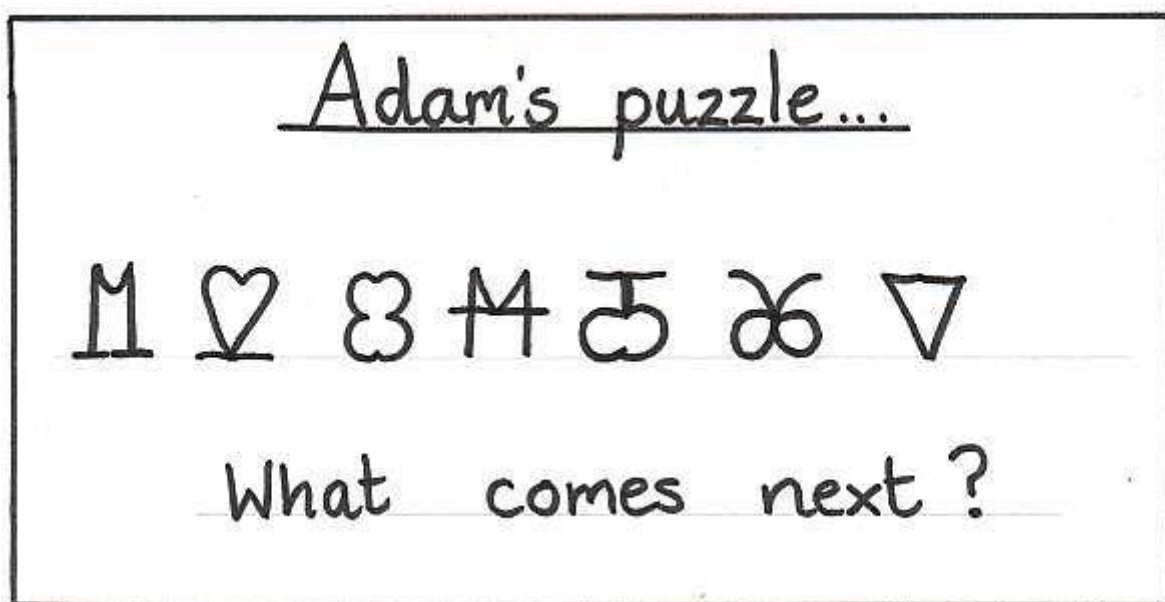

The Challenge to Lead Program is a 3-day residential leadership program run by the Rotary Club of Doncaster on **13th, 14th and 15th October, 2016**.

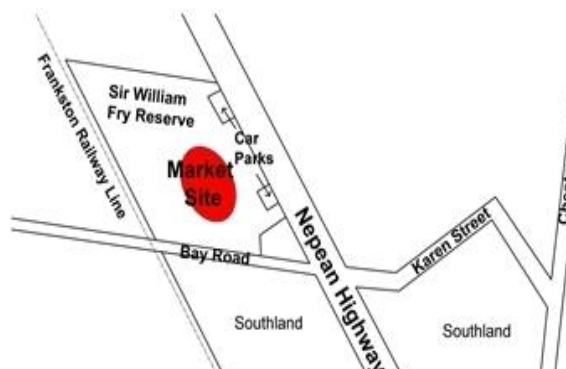
